

**“All have sinned ...”**

**Instructions:** Read the story, then go back and reread the story and answer the questions.

### **Genesis 3:1-13; Romans 5:12,18 NLT**

The Bible says: <sup>1</sup>Now the serpent was more crafty than any of the wild animals the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, “Did God really say, ‘You must not eat from any tree in the garden?’?” (NIV)

<sup>2</sup> “Of course we may eat fruit from the trees in the garden,” the woman replied. <sup>3</sup> “It’s only the fruit from the tree in the middle of the garden that we are not allowed to eat. God said, ‘You must not eat it or even touch it; if you do, you will die.’” (<sup>21</sup>) (<sup>22</sup>)

<sup>4</sup> “You won’t die!” the serpent replied to the woman. (<sup>23</sup>)

<sup>5</sup> “God knows that your eyes will be opened as soon as you eat it, and you will be like God, knowing both good and evil.”

<sup>6</sup> The woman was convinced. She saw that the tree was beautiful and its fruit looked delicious, and she wanted the wisdom it would give her. So she took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it, too. (<sup>4</sup>) <sup>7</sup> At that moment their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they sewed fig leaves together to cover themselves. (<sup>5</sup>)

<sup>8</sup> When the cool evening breezes were blowing, the man and his wife heard the LORD God walking about in the garden. So they hid from the LORD God among the trees. <sup>9</sup> Then the LORD God called to the man, “Where are you?” <sup>10</sup> He replied, “I heard you walking in the garden, so I hid. I was afraid because I was naked.” <sup>11</sup> “Who told you that you were naked?” the LORD God asked. “Have you eaten from the tree whose fruit I commanded you not to eat?” <sup>12</sup> The man replied, “It was the woman you gave me who gave me the fruit, and I ate it.” <sup>13</sup> Then the LORD God asked the woman, “What have you done?” “The serpent deceived [or tricked] me,” she replied. “That’s why I ate it.” (<sup>26</sup>)

Genesis 3:1-13

... <sup>12</sup> When Adam sinned, sin entered the world. Adam’s sin brought death, so death spread to everyone, for everyone sinned. (<sup>7</sup>)

... <sup>18</sup> Yes, Adam’s one sin brings condemnation [or judgement] for everyone, but Christ’s one act of righteousness brings a right relationship with God and new life for everyone. (<sup>8</sup>)
