QUESTIONS



1. What was Goliath trusting in to help him win the battle?

(See page 2 verses 4-7 and page 8, verse 45)

2. What or who was David trusting in to help him win the battle? (See page 7, verses 34-37 and page 8, verses 45-47)

3. Saul and his men saw the giant Goliath and they were frightened and afraid. David also saw the giant, but what else did David see or believe in that caused him to fight with the giant instead of running from him? (See page 4, verse 11 and page 8 verse 47-48)

4. We all have “giants” in our lives. It could be the giant of: not having the money we think we need, not understanding our school lessons, an illness, a mean person who picks on us, no father to help us, no husband to help us, etc.

What are some of your giants and do you think God can and wants to help you overcome these giants in your life? Explain your thoughts.

Note: The path to killing giants is to start putting our trust in God. We do this by reading and doing what God says in the Bible. When we start doing things God’s way, He can and will help us get our life together. David loved God, he loved God’s words. He memorized them and sought to obey them.

5. Why do you think God choose David to be the future King of Israel and helped David kill Goliath? Look at the front page of the story book, Page 1, and read the Bible passage under the picture of David tending the sheep.

Do you think David was faithful in his job of taking care of his father’s sheep? _____

Read verses 34 - 36 on page 7. When a lion and bear came to hurt a lamb, what did David do?

If David was faithful with this small job of taking care of his father’s sheep, do you think God thought he would also be faithful with a bigger job of taking care of God’s people as King of Israel? Why so?

6. What are some small jobs that you have been given to do, such as clean up your room, etc.

Do you think God is watching you to see how you do your little jobs, to see if He can give you a more important job? _____
